

Psalm 40(39):2, 4ab. 7-8a. 8b-9. 10. R. 8a, 9a






- 1/. O LORD, make me know your ways.

And you have forgiven the guilt of my sin.







- 3/. A voice I did not know <u>said</u> to me:


  'I freed your shoulder <u>from</u> the burden;



- 4/. More than watchmen for daybreak, let Israel hope for the LORD.







- 3/. When the just one cries <u>out</u>, the LORD hears, and rescues him in <u>all</u> his distress.


  The LORD is close <u>to</u> the broken-hearted; those whose spirit is <u>crushed</u> he will save.
