Ash Wednesday Have mercy on us, O Lord, for we have sinned.




Lectionary No. 219 Psalm 51(50):3-4. 5-6b. 12-13. 14, 17. R. cf. 3a

- 1/. Have mercy on me, O God, according to your merciful love; according to your great compassion, blot out my transgressions.
 Wash me completely <u>from</u> my iniquity, and cleanse me <u>from</u> my sin.
- 2/. My transgressions, truly I know them; my sin is always before me.
 Against you, you alone, have I sinned; what is evil in your sight I have done.
- 3/. Create a pure heart for <u>me</u>, O God; renew a steadfast spi<u>rit</u> within me.
 Do not cast me away <u>from</u> your presence; take not your holy spi<u>rit</u> from me.
- 4/. Restore in me the joy of <u>your</u> salvation; sustain in me a <u>willing</u> spirit.
 O Lord, o<u>pen</u> my lips and my mouth shall pro<u>claim</u> your praise.


First Sunday of Lent Year C Be with me, O Lord, in my distress.


Lectionary No. 24 Psalm 91(90):1-2. 10-11. 12-13. 14-15. R. cf. 15b



- 1/. He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High, and abides in the shade of the Almighty, says to the LORD: 'My refuge, my stronghold, my God in whom I trust!'
- 2/. Upon you no evil shall fall,
 no plague approach your tent.
 For you has he commanded his angels,
 to keep you in all your ways.
- 3/. They shall bear you <u>up</u>on their hands, lest you strike your foot <u>against a stone</u>. On the lion and the vi<u>per</u> you will tread, and trample the young lion and the serpent.
- 4/. Since he clings to me in <u>love</u>, I will free him, protect him, for <u>he</u> knows my name.
 When he calls on <u>me</u>, I will answer him;
 I will be with <u>him</u> in distress;
 I will deliver him, <u>and give him glory</u>.

Second Sunday in Lent Year C The LORD is my light and my salvation.






- 1/. The LORD is my <u>light</u> and my salvation; whom <u>shall</u> I fear? The LORD is the stronghold <u>of</u> my life; whom <u>should</u> I dread?
- 2/. O LORD, hear my voice when I call; have mercy and answer me.
 Of you my heart has spoken,
 'Seek his face.'
- 3/. It is your face, O <u>LORD</u>, that I seek; hide not your <u>face</u> from me. Dismiss not your ser<u>vant</u> in anger; you have <u>been</u> my help.
- 4/. I believe I shall <u>see</u> the LORD's goodness in the land <u>of</u> the living.
 Wait for the <u>LORD</u>; be strong; Be stout-hearted, and wait <u>for</u> the LORD!

Third Sunday in Lent Year C The LORD is compassionate and gracious.


Lectionary No. 30 Psalm 103(102):1-2. 3-4. 6-7. 8, 11. R. 8a



- 1/. Bless the LORD, <u>O</u> my soul, and all within me, <u>his</u> holy name.
 Bless the LORD, <u>O</u> my soul, and never forget <u>all</u> his benefits.
- 2/. It is the LORD who forgives <u>all</u> your sins, who heals every <u>one</u> of your ills, who redeems your <u>life</u> from the grave, who crowns you with mercy <u>and</u> compassion.
- 3/. The LORD does <u>deeds</u> of justice, gives full justice to all <u>who</u> are oppressed. He made known his <u>ways</u> to Moses, and his deeds to the child<u>ren</u> of Israel.
- 4/. The LORD is compassion<u>ate</u> and gracious, slow to anger <u>and</u> rich in mercy.For as the heavens are high ab<u>ove</u> the earth, so strong his mercy for <u>those</u> who fear him.

Fourth Sunday in Lent Year C Taste and see that the LORD is good.


Lectionary No. 33



- 1/. I will bless the <u>LORD</u> at all times, praise of him is <u>always</u> in my mouth. In the LORD my <u>soul</u> shall make its boast; the humble shall <u>hear</u> and be glad.
- 2/. Glorify the LORD with me; together let us praise his name.I sought the LORD, and he answered me; from all my terrors he set me free.
- 3/. Look towards him and be radiant; let your faces <u>not</u> be abashed. This lowly one <u>called</u>; the LORD heard, and rescued him from <u>all</u> his distress.

- 1/. When the LORD brought back the exiles of Sion, we <u>thought</u> we were dreaming. Then was our mouth <u>filled</u> with laughter; on our tongues, <u>songs</u> of joy.
- 2/. Then they said am<u>ong</u> the nations,'What great deeds the <u>LORD</u> worked for them!'What great deeds the LORD <u>worked</u> for us!Indeed, <u>we</u> were glad.
- 3/. Bring back our ex<u>iles</u>, O LORD, as <u>streams</u> in the Negeb. Those who are sow<u>ing</u> in tears will sing <u>when</u> they reap.
- 4/. They go out, they go out, <u>full</u> of tears, bearing <u>seed</u> for the sowing; they come back, they come back with a song, bear<u>ing</u> their sheaves.
