Psalm 51(50):3-4. 5-6b. 12-13. 14, 17. R. cf. 3a




- 1/. Have mercy on me, O God, according to your merciful love; according to your great compassion, blot out my transgressions.

- 3/. Our soul is waiting for the LORD.


  He is our help <u>and</u> our shield.

Psalm 95(94):1-2. 6-7b. 7c-9. R. 7c, 8a




- 1/. Come, let us ring out our joy to the LORD; hail the <u>rock</u> who saves us.

- 2/. O come; let us <u>bow</u> and bend low.
  Let us kneel before the <u>LORD</u> who made us, for he is our God, and <u>we</u> the people, the people of his pasture, the flock <u>of</u> his hand.
- 3/. O that today you would <u>listen</u> to his voice!

- 2/. He guides me along the <u>right</u> path, for the sake <u>of</u> his name.
  Though I should walk in the valley of the shadow <u>of</u> death, no evil would I fear, for <u>you</u> are with me.
  Your crook and your staff will give me comfort.
- 3/. You have prepared a table <u>before</u> me in the sight <u>of</u> my foes.My head you have anointed <u>with</u> oil;


my cup is overflowing.


- 4/. Surely goodness and mercy shall <u>follow</u> me all the days <u>of</u> my life.

- 2/. If you, O <u>LORD</u>, should mark iniquities, Lord, <u>who</u> could stand? But with you <u>is</u> found forgiveness, that you <u>may</u> be revered.
- 3/. I long for you, O LORD,my soul longs for his word.My soul awaits the Lordmore than watchmen for daybreak.
- 4/. More than watchmen for daybreak, let Israel hope for the LORD.
  For with the LORD there is mercy, in him is plentiful redemption.
  It is he who will redeem Israel from all its iniquities.
