

- 2/. How many are your works, O <u>LORD!</u>
 In wisdom you have <u>made</u> them all.
 The earth is full of your <u>creatures</u>.
 Bless the LORD, <u>O</u> my soul!
- 3/. All of these look to <u>you</u>
 to give them their food <u>in</u> due season.
 You give it, they gather it <u>up;</u>
 you open wide your hand, they <u>are</u> well filled.
- 4/. You take away their breath, they die, returning to the dust from which they came.You send forth your spirit, and they are created, and you renew the face of the earth.

- 1/. The LORD frustrates the designs of the nations; he defeats the plans of the peoples.The designs of the LORD stand for ever, the plans of his heart from age to age.
- 2/. Blessed the nation whose God <u>is</u> the LORD, the people he has chosen <u>as</u> his heritage. From the heavens the <u>LORD</u> looks forth; he sees all the whole human race.
- 3/. From the place where he <u>dwells</u> he gazes on all the dwellers <u>on</u> the earth, he who shapes the hearts <u>of</u> them all, and considers <u>all</u> their deeds.

- 5/. Blessed are you who look into the depths, seated upon the cherubim,
- 6/. Blessed are you in the firmament of heaven.

The command of the <u>LORD</u> is clear; it gives light to the eyes.


- 3/. The fear of the <u>LORD</u> is pure, abiding for ever.

- 1/. Let the redeemed of the <u>LORD</u> say this, those he redeemed from the hand <u>of</u> the foe, and gathered from <u>far</u>-off lands, from east and west, <u>north</u> and south.
- 2/. They wandered in a <u>bar</u>ren desert, finding no way to a city <u>they</u> could dwell in. Hungry they <u>were</u> and thirsty; their soul was fainting within them.
- 3/. Then they cried to the <u>LORD</u> in their need, and he rescued them from <u>their</u> distress, and he guided them along <u>a</u> straight path, to reach a city <u>they</u> could dwell in.
- 4/. Let them thank the <u>LORD</u> for his mercy, his wonders for the whole <u>human race</u>; for he satisfies the <u>thirs</u>ty soul, and the hungry he fills <u>with</u> good things.
