

By the LORD has this been done


a marvel <u>in</u> our eyes.

- 2/. I will bless the LORD who gives me counsel, who even at night directs my heart.


 I keep the LORD before me always; with him at my right hand, I shall not be moved.

- 2/. He guides me along the <u>right</u> path, for the sake <u>of</u> his name.
 Though I should walk in the valley of the shadow <u>of</u> death, no evil would I fear, for <u>you</u> are with me.
 Your crook and your staff will <u>give</u> me comfort.
- 3/. You have prepared a table <u>before</u> me in the sight <u>of</u> my foes.

 My head you have anointed <u>with</u> oil;

my cup is overflowing.

- 4/. Surely goodness and mercy shall <u>follow</u> me all the days <u>of</u> my life.
 - In the LORD's own house shall \underline{I} dwell for length of <u>days</u> unending.

Psalm 33(32):1-2. 4-5. 18-19. R. 22

 Give thanks to the LORD upon the harp; with a ten-stringed lute <u>sing</u> him songs.
- 2/. The word of the <u>LORD</u> is upright, and all his works <u>to</u> be trusted.


 The LORD loves just<u>ice</u> and right, and his merciful love <u>fills</u> the earth.
- 3/. Yes, the LORD's eyes are on those who fear him, who hope in his merciful love, to rescue their soul from death, to keep them alive in famine.


Sixth Sunday of Easter Year A

Psalm 66(65):1-3a. 4-5. 6-7a. 16, 20. R. 1








The Ascension of the Lord

- 1/. All peoples, <u>clap</u> your hands.


 Cry to God with <u>shouts</u> of joy!
