I will sing for ever of your mercies, O LORD.


*Lectionary No. 13* Psalm 89(88):4-5. 16-17. 27. 29. R. cf 2a



- 1/. 'With my chosen one I have <u>made</u> a covenant;
  I have sworn to Da<u>vid</u> my servant:
  I will establish your descend<u>ants</u> for ever,
  and set up your throne <u>through</u> all ages.'
- 2/. How blessed the people who know your praise, who walk, O LORD, in the light of your face, who find their joy every day in your name, who make your righteousness their joyful acclaim.
- 3/. 'He will call out to me: "You <u>are my father</u>, my God, the rock of <u>my salvation</u>".I will keep my faithful love <u>for him always</u>; with him my coven<u>ant</u> shall last.'

# The Nativity of the Lord Midnight Mass Today a Saviour has been born to us; who is Christ the Lord.

*Lectionary No. 14* Psalm 96(95):1-2a. 2b-3. 11-12a. 12b-13b. 13cd. R. Luke 2:11




- 1/. O sing a new song to the LORD;sing to the LORD, all the earth.O sing to the LORD; bless his name.
- 2/. Proclaim his salvation <u>day</u> by day.Tell among the na<u>tions</u> his glory, and his wonders among <u>all</u> the peoples.
- 3/. Let the heavens rejoice and <u>earth</u> be glad; let the sea and all within it <u>thun</u>der praise. Let the field and all it <u>bears</u> rejoice.
- 4/. Then will all the trees of the wood <u>shout</u> for joy at the presence of the LORD, <u>for</u> he comes, he comes to judge the earth.
- 5/. He will judge the world with justice; and the peoples <u>with</u> faithfulness.

> *Lectionary No. 15* Psalm 97(96):1, 6. 11-12




- 1/. The LORD is king, let <u>earth</u> rejoice; let the many is<u>lands</u> be glad. The skies proclaim <u>his</u> justice; all peoples <u>see</u> his glory.
- 2/. Light shines forth <u>for</u> the just one, and joy for the up<u>right</u> of heart. Rejoice in the LORD, all you just; to the memory of his holiness give thanks.

#### The Nativity of the Lord Mass during the Day

All the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God.

*Lectionary No. 16* Psalm 98(97): 1. 2-3b. 3c-4. 5-6. R. 3cd




- 1/. O sing a new song to the LORD, for he has worked wonders. His right hand and his holy arm have brought salvation.
- 2/. The LORD has made known <u>his</u> salvation, has shown his deliverance <u>to</u> the nations. He has remembered his mer<u>ci</u>ful love and his truth for the <u>house</u> of Israel.
- 3/. All the ends of the <u>earth</u> have seen the salvation <u>of</u> our God.
  Shout to the LORD, <u>all</u> the earth; break forth into joyous song, and sing <u>out</u> your praise.
- 4/. Sing psalms to the LORD with the harp, with the harp and the sound of song.With trumpets and the sound of the horn, raise a shout before the King, the LORD.

# The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph Years A, B, C

Blessed are all who fear the LORD, and walk in his ways.

*Lectionary No. 17* Psalm 128(127):1-2. 3. 4-5. R. cf 2





- 1/. Blessed are all who fear the LORD, and walk in his ways!By the labour of your hands you shall eat. You will be blessed and prosper.
- 2/. Your wife like a <u>fruit</u>ful vine in the heart <u>of</u> your house; your children like shoots <u>of</u> the olive a<u>round</u> your table.
- 3/. Indeed thus <u>shall</u> be blessed the husband who <u>fears</u> the LORD. May the LORD bless <u>you</u> from Sion. May you see Jeru<u>sa</u>lem prosper all the days <u>of</u> your life!

# The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph Year B (Optional)

He, the LORD, is our God; he remembers his covenant for ever.

*Lectionary No. 17* Psalm 105(104):1-2. 3-4. 6-7. 8-9. R. 7a, 8a



- 1/. Give thanks to the LORD; pro<u>claim</u> his name. Make known his deeds a<u>mong</u> the peoples. O sing to him, <u>sing</u> his praise; tell all his won<u>der</u>ful works!
- 2/. Glory in his holy name;

Let the hearts that seek the <u>LORD</u> rejoice. Turn to the LORD <u>and</u> his strength; constantly <u>seek</u> his face.


- 3/. Remember the wonders <u>he</u> has done, his marvels and his <u>words</u> of judgement.
  O children of Abra<u>ham</u>, his servant,
  O descendants of the Ja<u>cob</u> he chose.
- 4/. He remembers his coven<u>ant</u> for ever: the promise he ordained for a thousand <u>gen</u>erations, the covenant he <u>made</u> with Abraham,

the oath he <u>swore</u> to Isaac.

Blessed are they who dwell in your house, O Lord.

- 1/. How lovely is your <u>dwelling place</u>, O LORD <u>of hosts</u>. My soul is longing <u>and yearning</u> for the courts <u>of the LORD</u>. My heart and my <u>flesh</u> cry out to the <u>living</u> God.
- 2/. Blessed are they who dwell in your house, for ever singing your praise.Blessed the people whose strength is in you, whose heart is set on pilgrim ways.
- 3/. O LORD God of hosts, <u>hear</u> my prayer; give ear, O <u>God</u> of Jacob.
  Turn your eyes, O <u>God</u>, our shield; look on the face of <u>your</u> anointed.

# The Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God May God be gracious and bless us.





*Lectionary No. 18* Psalm 67(66):2-3. 5. 6. 8. R. 2a

- 1/. May God be <u>grac</u>ious and bless us and let his face shed its <u>light</u> upon us. So will your ways be <u>known</u> upon earth and all nations <u>learn</u> your salvation.
- 2/. Let the nations be <u>glad</u> and shout for joy, with uprightness you <u>rule</u> the peoples; you guide the <u>nations</u> on earth.
- 3/. Let the peoples <u>praise</u> you, O God; let all the peo<u>ples</u> praise you. May God still <u>give</u> us his blessing that all the ends of the <u>earth</u> may revere him.

# *The Epiphany of the Lord* All the nations on earth shall fall prostrate before you, O Lord






- 1/. O God, give your judgement to the king, to a king's son your justice, that he may judge your people in justice, and your poor in right judgement.
- 2/. In his days jus<u>tice</u> shall flourish, and great peace till the <u>moon</u> is no more. He shall rule from <u>sea</u> to sea, from the River to the bounds <u>of</u> the earth.
- 3/. The kings of Tarshish and the islands shall <u>pay</u> him tribute.
  The kings of Sheba and Seba shall <u>bring</u> him gifts.
  Before him all kings <u>shall</u> fall prostrate, all nations shall serve him.
- 4/. For he shall rescue the needy <u>when</u> they cry, the poor who have <u>no</u> one to help.He will have pity on the weak <u>and</u> the needy, and save the lives <u>of</u> the needy.

# *Second Sunday after the Nativity* The Word became flesh and dwelt among us.


Lectionary No. 19 Psalm 147:12-13. 14-15. 19-20. R. John 1:14



- 1/. O Jerusalem, glorify the LORD!
  O Sion, praise your God!
  He has strengthened the bars of your gates;
  he has blessed your child<u>ren</u> within you.
- 2/. He established peace <u>on</u> your borders; he gives you your fill of <u>fin</u>est wheat. He sends out his word <u>to</u> the earth, and swiftly runs <u>his</u> command.
- 3/. He reveals his <u>word</u> to Jacob;
  to Israel, his dec<u>rees</u> and judgements.
  He has not dealt thus with <u>other</u> nations;
  he has not taught <u>them</u> his judgements.

# *The Baptism of the Lord Years A, B, C* The LORD will bless his people with peace.

*Lectionary No. 21* Psalm 29(28):1-2. 3ac-4. 3b, 9b-10. R. 11b




- 1/. Ascribe to the LORD, you heavenly powers, ascribe to the LORD glory and strength.
  Ascribe to the LORD the glory of his name; bow down before the LORD, majestic in holiness.
- 2/. The voice of the LORD up<u>on</u> the waters, the LORD on the immensity of waters; the voice of the LORD <u>full</u> of power; the voice of the LORD <u>full</u> of splendour.
- 3/. The God of <u>glory</u> thunders; in his Temple they <u>all</u> cry, 'Glory!' The LORD sits enthroned ab<u>ove</u> the flood; the LORD sits as <u>king</u> for ever.

# The Baptism of the Lord Year B (Optional)

With joy will you draw water from the springs of salvation.


Lectionary No. 21



- 1/. Behold, God <u>is</u> my salvation!
  I will trust, and will not <u>be</u> afraid; for the LORD is my <u>strength</u> and my praise, and he has been <u>my</u> salvation.
  With joy will <u>you</u> draw water from the springs <u>of</u> salvation.
- 2/. Give thanks to the LORD, <u>in</u>voke his name; make known among the peo<u>ples</u> his deeds; proclaim that his name <u>is</u> exalted.

3/. Sing to the LORD for <u>he</u> has wrought wonders; let this be known through <u>all</u> the earth. Shout aloud and sing praise, you who <u>dwell</u> in Sion, for great in your midst is the Holy <u>One</u> of Israel.

# *The Baptism of the Lord Year C (Optional)* Bless the LORD, O my soul!





- 1/. O LORD my God, <u>how</u> great you are, clothed in <u>maj</u>esty and honour, wrapped in light as with a robe!
  You stretch out the <u>hea</u>vens like a tent.
- 2/. On the waters you lay the founda<u>tion</u> for your dwelling.

You <u>make</u> the clouds your chariot; you ride on the <u>wings</u> of the wind. You make the <u>winds</u> your messengers, flame and <u>fire</u> your servants.

- 3/. How many are <u>your</u> works, O LORD! In wisdom you <u>have</u> made them all. The earth is <u>full</u> of your creatures. Vast and wide is the <u>span</u> of the sea, with its creeping <u>things</u> past counting, living <u>things</u> great and small.
- 4/. All of <u>these</u> look to you to give them their <u>food</u> in due season. You give it, they <u>gather</u> it up; you open wide your <u>hand</u>, they are well filled.
- 5/. You hide your face, <u>they</u> are dismayed;
  You take away their <u>breath</u>, they die,
  returning to the dust from <u>which</u> they came.
  You send forth your spirit, and <u>they</u> are created,
  and you renew the <u>face</u> of the earth.
